The introduction of databases in place of paper records in recent years has allowed the industry, property management and maintenance in particular, to perform more efficiently. As this proceeds, systems tailored to the specific needs of a company will yield even greater benefits.

Internet-based management tools developed very quickly and were considered revolutionary 20 years ago when the smartphone was first launched. 'Apps' became one of the areas of fastest development and were widely accepted by almost every user.

Technological record keeping and data management has always been a tedious yet crucial part of a building surveyor's job, especially for those in property management and maintenance (PM). With an accurate and easily accessible and updatable database, diagnosis of building defects can be much more efficient. Apart from off-the-shelf software, an e-platform custom made by the in-house information technology department also allows everyone in the team to access updates in real time.

Swire Properties is regarded as one of the pioneers in this area. It has a long history of improving its systems to record building defects and increase efficiency in daily routine reporting. Senior Technical Services Manager and HKIS Building Surveying Division Past Chairman Sr Daniel Chang recalls, "At the outset we purchased off-the-shelf software with customisations. After a few years, the IT team recognised the need to develop our own property management system in order to further enhance productivity and improve work efficiency. The first generation was a centralised system launched in 2003. The online property management system (PMS) consisted of three parts, namely purchase order, work order and inventory module (stocks management). The beauty of it was an integration of maintenance request with outsourcing works and inventory record which formerly worked separately without communication."

Since then, the company has continued to upgrade its system. For instance, an e-patrol system for building management staff was developed in 2014. By using mobile phones, staff members can record and send data instantly to PMS. If the item is related to tenants, a work order will be automatically sent to the engineering department for immediate action. This results in better service quality than conventional reporting channels that inevitably cause delays.

Other recent examples include the e-tender, introduced in late 2015, which requires contractors to log in for tender information and then submit their own online. The rationale for this was that there were diverse project/job tenders, big and small, which were related to a variety of requirements, like air-conditioning, water, electricity and even building works. Rather than submitting paper documents by post, fax or delivery to a tender collection box, contractors can now submit tenders online. and the system is equipped with a series of automated features providing heightened confidentiality. What's more, the contractor list was digitised in 2017, replacing stacks of company files. This facilitates analysis or searching of records of prospective contractors.

Sr Chang opines, "All data obtained is useful in compiling various analytical reports, e.g. cost distribution, services requests and purchase order distribution on portfolios that tell us which contractors carried out what type of maintenance/repair as well as distribution of their work. After analyzing work orders received we can recognise which systems have regular problems and figure out possible sources of the problems. Customer satisfaction level can also be checked as we set a time frame for service delivery and see how many orders meet their designated time slots."

The digital trend has prevailed over the last decade and the industry recognises that automated operation will continue in the long term. Since it's costly to develop in-house e-platforms, companies often opt for external consultants for advice and implementation. Established in 2013, Core Vision Surveyors Limited is the brainchild of Director Sr Dominic Chau, a programme developer for an e-platform that started out as a security management tool. Using his background in property management, Sr Chau has further developed this tool into

something building surveyors can use when taking over newly completed buildings, for condition surveys and for property management. Its diverse clientele includes property management companies and facility managers.

Sr Chau contends, "Internet-based management tools developed very quickly and were considered revolutionary 20 years ago when the smartphone was first launched. 'Apps' became one of the areas of fastest development and were widely accepted by almost every user. Indeed, the smartphone, internet connectivity, software development and associated applications had become more sophisticated by about five years ago. This enabled the easier development and realisation of our dream of more relevant handheld device applications, including what we (together with our IT business partner) developed — the 'Smart Patrol System' specifically for property management staff to use for routine patrolling work. Our system is very user-friendly and I found that, by using similar functions, it could also be modified for our 'Building Surveying Practitioners' to use in our projects. The set-up and operating costs are low, with only a monthly rental fee, so there is no initial investment.

"I initiated the idea of applying IT-related applications in my property management work in 1999. I was participating in an IT project on improving property management services using 'internet or web-based management'. At that time, very few companies ran web-based systems. We formed a company named Intellinet Management Limited to promote property management with internet and emerging technologies. As I was well-versed in both IT and building surveying, I could see market needs and develop software to suit the PM industry."

Sr Chau and Sr Chang agree that in recent years

the higher level of acceptance of digitised and paperless development has been a driver for greater efficiency. Sr Chau adds, "If we survey for a large-scale project we typically end up with a thousand pictures, and it's time consuming to identify them one by one. I am now researching how to add a GPS map or floor plan to match with the site pictures taken. Sometimes it's hard to recognise photos when trying to match them with locations. If a standard report format can be automatically created, staff can complete all steps on-site without revisiting it when they are back in the office."

Sr Chang echoes the view that the industry is going paperless, like his e-tender system. "In the long run, we'll look at the jobs or workflow and see what digitisation and data analysis can be applied. We are thinking of work audit systems, e.g. when colleagues finish their work, we carry out a sample check, then issue a paper report with the findings. Now, an electronic report format is being developed. We observed that respective business units, like finance, technical and leasing, have been exploring how e-platforms can help and what innovations can be made. A custom-made system is ideal, as we know the system configuration and can add whatever is needed.

"Whenever new systems or features are introduced, it's vital to explain the objective to stakeholders like staff and working partners. We are in constant communication with users to share the benefits along the way when upgrading the system. Many of our contractors are SMEs, so we provide seminars with related leaflets and instructions. We typically encounter only a few hiccups in the first half year. Afterwards, it runs smoothly."

數碼記錄提升效益定制系統成趨勢

數據庫近年被廣泛應用,逐漸取代以往文書記錄,大大提升了業界在物業管理和維修保養這方面的工作效益。長遠來看,企業按照業務發展需要定制數據系統,將會帶來更大裨益。

記錄備份數碼化和數據管理的工作看似單調乏味,但對建築測量師來說卻非常 重要,對樓宇管理和維修保養影響甚鉅。確保資料庫內容準確、擷取資料途徑 簡易和定期更新資料,有助查找樓宇的損毀狀況。除了購置有關軟件外,資訊 科技部門亦可定制網上平台,讓團隊成員即時擷取最新的資料。

太古地產是市場上最先推動記錄備份數碼化的公司之一,在過去多年不斷改良系統,全面地記錄樓宇的保養情況和提升日常匯報機制的效率。太古地產高級技術統籌經理及香港測量師學會建築測量組前主席鄭偉業測量師說:「我們一開始向外購置定製軟件,但數年後資訊科技部認為有需要自行開發物業管理系統,進一步提升生產力和工作效率。我們在2003年推出第一代中央系統,這個網上物業管理系統由三個部分組成,分別是採購訂單、工作列表和庫存系統(存貨管理)。這套系統的精妙所在是整合維修工作、採購、庫存記錄,解決以往各自為政、缺乏溝通的問題。」

自此,太古地產不斷提升系統,例如在2014年建立了網上巡樓系統,方便負責物業管理的員工工作,他們利用手機,即時將記錄和數據傳送到物業管理系統。若項目涉及租戶,有關工作訂單將自動發送到工程部門,提醒有關員工採取即時行動。系統改善了服務質素,辦免一般匯報方法引起的延誤問題。

其他近期例子還包括在 2015 年推出的網上投標系統,承辦商可登入系統取得相關投標資料,並在網上遞交標書。推出系統的原意是考慮到各項目或工程投標的規模大小各異,而且涉及不同要求和準則,像冷氣系統、水、電,甚至樓宇工程。有別於以郵遞、傳真或親身遞交標書,承辦商現可在網上遞交標書,系統還配備多樣自動化功能,加強文件的保密性。另外,太古地產在 2017 年將承辦商名冊數碼化,取代以往厚重的文件夾,有助分析或搜尋承辦商記錄。

鄭偉業測量師說:「所有收集得來的數據有助建立分析報告,像工程成本分配、所需服務以及採購訂單,我們從中得悉承辦商所提供的維修或保養工程類別,以及他們所分配的工作。當我們分析工作指示後,可從中得知哪些系統經常出現問題,找出導致問題的根本原因。我們亦可以設定提供服務的時限,留意在預設時間內完成服務的成功率,從而監測顧客的滿意程度。」

數碼化在過去十年發展迅速,業界認為自動化運作是長遠的發展趨勢。由於企業自行開發網上平台成本高昂,故一般做法是聘用顧問公司,徵詢意見和設立平台。周忠耀測量師在 2013 年創辦科爾測量師行有限公司,並出任公司的董事,同時身兼程式開發員,推出起初作保安管理之用的網上平台。周忠耀測量師具物業管理經驗,他其後調整有關網上平台,方便建築測量師在接手處理新建樓宇時,可以透過平台進行狀況測量及物業管理的工作。這個網上平台擁有廣泛客戶群,包括物業管理公司和設施管理經理。

周忠耀測量師說:「互聯網管理工具發展日新月異,它在智能手機於20年前剛推出的時候,被視為革命性科技。手機程式更成為發展最快的科技領域之一,而且廣受用家歡迎。現今智能手機、互聯網連線、軟件和相關應用程式開發的技術已較五年前成熟,因此我們亦較易開發更多相關的隨身裝置及程式,像我們(與科技公司合作)開發的『智能巡邏系統』就便利了物業管理員的日常巡樓工作。系統使用方法簡單,而且作簡單調整後,系統還適用於建築測量師。建立系統和系統的運作成本低廉,公司只需每月繳費租用系統,可節省投資開發的成本。」

「我最初想到以科技應用程式處理物業管理工作是在1999年,當時我參與一個科技項目,旨在利用『互聯網或網上管理』工具改善物業管理服務。那時候只有少數公司設有網上系統。我們成立了智網管理有限公司,將互聯網以及其他新興科技應用在物業管理。因為我兼備資訊科技和建築測量的知識,所以我留意到市場的需求,並開發更多適用於物業管理的軟件。」

兩位受訪測量師同樣認為近年數碼化及無紙化的發展趨勢有助提升效益。周忠耀測量師補充説:「若測量項目規模龐大,一般涉及數以千計的圖片,逐一查閱非常費時。我正在研究如何使用 GPS 地圖或平面圖去配對工程現場圖片,因為很多時候要找出圖片所攝的位置很困難。如果我們可以自動建立標準報告格式,員工便可即場完成工作,日後亦無需重返現場。」

鄭偉業測量師認為業界逐漸採用無紙化的工作模式,正如太古地產網上投標系統。他說:「長遠來看,我們將繼續觀察工作內容或工作流程,思考數碼化和數據分析是否適用其中。審計系統是其中一個例子,當同事完成工作後,我們會抽樣檢查,然後將結果以書面報告形式記錄下來;目前正研究以電子報告格式取代書面報告。我們留意到有關業務部門,像財政部、技術部和租務部會善用網上平台和探討更多創新技術。最理想的做法是自行定制系統,這樣我們更清楚系統的結構和可加設需要的功能。」

「不論推出新系統或功能,我們都需要向各持份者,包括有,包括員工和合作夥伴,解釋清楚期的。我們在提升系統時,與用戶保持溝通,向他們講解系統商很多都是中小企,所以我們的承辦講座,以及派發傳單和新別。我們一般會在頭半年面對一些小問題,但之後工作漸入佳境,過程順利。」

Students share their visions of future cityscapes in the annual competition

The 2018 HKIS Create Your District Competition broadened its appeal to students and others with a multimedia competition, a mobile truck exhibition and tours of Wan Chai. This all served to raise awareness of the surveyor's role in society and of the profession as a potential career.

Following the success of the inaugural Create Your District Competition in 2017, HKIS has given this year's competition a big twist in the form of a larger scale of operation and wider public engagement. This activity incorporated the Institute's development goal set for this year — "Engage, Mentor, Grow and Connect". Most importantly, the competition provided a platform for students and the public to learn more about the role surveyors play in urban development.

The competition allowed students to showcase their ideas on urban development using a 3D model or a multimedia presentation to present new visions for a district. Sr Dick Kwok, HKIS Immediate Past President explained the rationale behind choosing Wan Chai as the target district. He noted that Wan Chai, one of Hong Kong's oldest districts, has preserved Chinese and Western cultures and many historical buildings. He said, "Many conservation projects, such as the Blue House, Lee Tung Street and Wo Cheong Pawn Shop, have become buildings with ambience and vitality, yet have preserved their rich cultural heritage. On the other hand, Wan Chai is also home to new buildings and unique, well-designed small districts such as Three Pacific Place and Star Street. The mix of old and new buildings gives Wan Chai a unique cultural tapestry with a new vibrancy.

"Once consensus was reached, I worked together with the Competition Organising Committee Chairman Sr Billy Wong to seek more sponsorship and engagement from our network of stakeholders and supporting organisations. To ensure seamless functioning, a public relations company was appointed. I offer kudos to supporting organisations and to various stakeholders for their generous sponsorships which meant additional resources with which to 'play the game' differently."

New elements were added to the development of the competition, such as the brand-new multimedia category and a media workshop specially designed for student participants to learn multimedia video making. Another innovation was the mobile truck named "Surveyor One", which was equipped with information panels about the roles and work of surveyors. It visited eight schools as well as local communities all over the city during the period 4 – 17 October before reaching the climax of the competition — the launch of the Public Exhibition at Lee Tung Avenue from 20 to 31 October 2018.

For the first time, a public voting page was created online to stimulate more participation. Those who cast a vote for their favourite Wan Chai model or video could enter a lucky draw drawn at the final event. Attractive grand prizes included an Apple Watch Series 4, supermarket gift vouchers and hotel buffet coupons. HKIS also specially produced a set of six postcards displaying old and new Wan Chai spots as souvenirs of the event. The exhibition was well received by the public, partly because of the collective memories for local residents.

Following the excellent response last year, this year's competition also yielded an overwhelming number of submissions by around 200 Forms 3 to 6 students from 31 secondary schools. They made up 58 teams to share their visions of ideal future cityscapes for the Wan Chai District. The Jury Assessment Presentation was held on 6 October 2018, eight teams from each category were selected as final winners. This year, the Urban Renewal Authority (URA) emerged as a strategic partner of the campaign and lent its support by sponsoring the URA Community & Sustainable Development Award. According to URA Chairman Sr Victor So Hing-woh this was to encourage participating students to better understand the community and to unleash their creativity to express their vision for a sustainable future development for Wan Chai through planning and design under the professional guidance of our fellow surveyors.

The highlight of the campaign was when the Public Exhibition turned the Central Piazza of Lee Tung Avenue into an edutainment zone with

a slew of innovative programmes. Our members also volunteered to station themselves on site to address questions raised by visitors. Apart from showcasing the students' winning 3D models and multimedia videos, an interactive game zone was established featuring simple matching games enhancing the public's understanding of the work of surveyors. Each player needed to match the surveyors with their areas of specialisation in one minute, and winners received a coin with which to redeem their prize from a claw machine. Then, LEGO® Building Bricks stole the limelight with eight iconic buildings representative of Wan Chai. They were exhibited for the first time with support from Hong Kong LEGO Users Group. In addition, "My Ideal City Created By a Thousand" — a gigantic mosaic image wall — attracted the participation of families across generations. From 20 to 27 October, exhibition participants were encouraged to upload their photos to Instagram with the hashtag #hkissurveyors. Uploaded photos then had a chance to form part of the gigantic photo wall mosaic. The event proved a great success and drew more than 20,000 visitors to the site.

The much-anticipated Award Presentation Ceremony was held on Lee Tung Avenue with over 180 guests, students, winners, participants and sponsors. All winners' efforts and creativity received recognition in the presence of Guest of Honour Mr Matthew Cheung Kin-chung, Chief Secretary for Administration. However, that didn't mean a full stop to the campaign because the public guided tours were postponed to 11 November and it was wrapped up nicely by the energetic participants who signed up for two designated routes, one covering the north part of Wan Chai, starting from Blue House Cluster and ending at Revenue Tower, while the other toured the west part of the district, from Old Wan Chai Post Office and the Pawn Shop to Three Pacific Place and Star Street.

Sr Billy Wong opined, "Looking back, the competition entries this year are truly original, both 3D models and multimedia videos. They

fully display the innovative potential and vitality of the younger generation. We look forward to taking the competition to another level of success in the coming year. I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to all schools, students and the public for participating in our programmes, as well as for the support of HKIS members, our strategic partners, sponsors and supporting organisations."

Sr Dick Kwok echoed, "Such outreach programmes present a priceless opportunity to touch new audiences, in this case offering secondary school students a clearer picture of the role surveyors play in all aspects of the land and property development process. I am very grateful and honoured to acknowledge the creativity and dedication of the young generation who presented their impressive competition entries. As well as encouraging these young minds to unleash their creativity, our efforts just might inspire a few to consider the surveying profession as a future career."

This time, the campaign reached an unimaginably large audience with the trailblazing Mobile Truck Exhibition. Such public platforms have successfully raised the profile of HKIS and served as a most fitting way to inaugurate the Institute's landmark 35th year in 2019. During the 2018 Annual Dinner, a three-minute video documenting this signature campaign was played before members, guests and industry professionals. It won rounds of applause and recognition. Indeed, some statistics may help quantify the output of the campaign. About 4,200 sets (six pcs in a set) of postcards were given to exhibition games participants and award ceremony guests and participants; 300 booklets to award ceremony guests, participants and winning students; 500 event tee shirts to exhibition helpers and volunteers, award ceremony guests and participants; and 900 other gifts to exhibition games participants that included HKIS bottles, pen sets and umbrellas.

新一代以創意 構建理想城市

由香港測量師學會主辦的「細看社區歷史 構建『你』 想灣仔」地區發展創作比賽(下稱「比賽」)今年吸引 一眾學生和社會公眾踴躍參與,比賽新增了多媒體影片 比賽、流動車展覽和灣仔區公眾導賞團。今次比賽成功 讓公眾對測量師在社會上擔當的角色有更深的認識,同 時吸引更多年輕人考慮投身測量行業。

學會在 2017 年舉辦首屆地區發展創作比賽,取得空前成功,今年 再接再厲,擴大比賽規模之餘,還大大提升公眾的參與度。今年的 比賽充分實現了學會「測量傳承」這個發展目標。更重要的是,學 生和公眾透過比賽更加認識測量師在城市發展擔當的角色。

參賽學生積極表達自己對城市發展的看法,利用模型或多媒體影片展現地區發展的新思維。對於選擇灣仔區作為今年比賽的主題地區的原因,上任會長郭岳忠測量師指出,灣仔區是香港最早發展地區之一,中西文化薈萃,新舊建築兼備。他說:「很多保育項目,例如藍屋、利東街及和昌大押,不但為舊區注入活力,也展現了豐富的文化歷史底蘊。另一方面,灣仔區新建了很多具特色和精心設計的小區,如太古廣場三期和星街。新舊建築物交匯並存,為灣仔區交織出一幅獨特而具活力的文化織錦。」

他續說:「在取得共識後,我與活動籌委會主席黃健兒測量師緊密合作,與其他持份者和支持機構聯繫,盡力爭取他們的贊助和參與。為了令比賽順利進行,我們還聘用了公關公司。我衷心感謝各支持機構和持份者慷慨贊助比賽,讓我們有更多資源,籌辦與別不同的活動。」

今年的比賽亦加入不少新元素,包括全新的多媒體影片組別和舉辦多媒體影片工作坊,讓參賽學生掌握更多關於多媒體影片的製作技巧。另一創新元素是推出「測量號」流動車,為公眾展出有關測量師工作和角色的資訊。流動車在10月4日至17日期間,先後巡迴八間中學和香港各區。之後就是今年比賽最備受矚目的環節-於10月20日至31日期間在利東街舉行的公眾展覽。

今年比賽首度設立網上公眾投票,讓公眾在眾多模型作品和多媒體影片當中投選出「我最喜愛作品大獎」,參與投票的市民更可在比賽結束後參加抽獎,有機會贏取豐富獎品,包括 Apple Watch Series 4、超市禮券和酒店自助餐券。香港測量師學會特意設計了一套六款以灣仔新舊景點為主題的名信片作為比賽的紀念品。展覽勾起港人的集體回憶,得到公眾熱烈迴響。

去年比賽獲得熱烈迴響,今年比賽同樣反應踴躍,來自 31 間中學約 200 個中三至中六學生報名參賽報名。參賽學生分成 58 隊,分享他們將灣仔區構建成理想社區的願景。決賽入圍面試在 10 月 6

日舉行,每個組別共 8 個得獎隊伍。市區重建局擔任今年比賽的策略伙伴,並贊助「市區重建局社區及可持續發展大獎」。市區重建局主席蘇慶和測量師希望鼓勵參賽學生在測量師的專業指導下,多了解社區發展,發揮創意,分享他們對未來灣仔區可持續發展的想法。

今年比賽的一大吸引之處是公眾展覽,成功將灣仔利東街中庭變成遊戲學習區,舉辦多個創新活動。多位學會會員擔任義工到展覽場地幫忙,主動解答公眾問題。除了展出得獎的立體模型和多媒體影片外,現場更設有互動遊戲區,公眾透過展板及簡單配對遊戲,更深入地了解測量師的工作。參與遊戲的市民需要在一分鐘之內配對測量師和他們所屬的專業範疇,成功配對的市民可獲得扭蛋金幣,從現場的扭蛋機中扭出禮物。香港樂高迷用戶組亦大力支持今次展覽活動,首次展出八個以LEGO®積木創作的灣仔代表性建築。另外,現場還設置「千人齊創『你』想城市——巨型馬賽克相片裝置」,吸引不少家庭參與。在10月20日至27日期間,公眾只要將照片上傳至Instagram並輸入#hkissurveyors,照片即有機會成為馬賽克拼圖的一部份。公眾反應熱烈,吸引超過20,000人參觀展覽。

萬眾期待的頒獎禮在利東街舉行,逾 180 位嘉賓、學生、得獎者、參與者和贊助機構出席典禮。主禮嘉賓政務司司長張建宗表揚各得獎者的努力和創意。然而,今次比賽並未就此完結,公眾導賞團延後在 11 月 11 日舉行,一眾活力充沛的參加者可以選擇指定路線,包括由藍屋建築群出發,以稅務大樓為終點的北行線,以及以舊灣仔郵政局為起點,途經和昌大押、太古廣場三座至星街的西行線。

黃健兒測量師分享說:「回顧今年的比賽,不論是立體模型或者多媒體影片等參賽作品都創意非凡,展現了年輕一代的創造力和活力。我們期望來年的比賽將會取得更大的成功。我亦藉此機會感謝參賽學校、學生和公眾對我們的支持,同時也向各會員、策略伙伴、贊助及支持機構表示謝意。」

郭岳忠測量師説:「今次比賽讓我們有機會接觸到更多市民,為中學生提供更清晰的概念,使他們更了解測量師在土地和樓宇發展過程中的角色。我十分欣賞年輕一代,他們透過參賽作品展現自己的創意和決心。當我們鼓勵年輕人發揮創意的同時,相信我們也啟發了部份人對投身測量業的憧憬。」

透過流動車展覽,今年比賽吸引到社會 廣泛關注,公眾參與度更是超爭預期的高。這種公眾活動成功提升學會的程 象,為學會來年成立35周年拉開帷 在2018周年晚宴上,我們向各一分場 賓客和行業精英播放一段長數一一段 資客和行業精英播放一段大數 實動花絮短片,介紹今次比賽 雪動,成果備受肯定。 數據亦有助我們量化今次活動的市民、 例如,我們向參加展覽遊戲的市民、頒



獎典禮的嘉賓和來賓送出約4,200套(一套六款)名信片;又向頒獎典禮的嘉賓、來賓和得獎學生派發了300本場刊;另外向展覽的工作人員和義工、頒獎典禮的嘉賓和來賓提供500件活動 T 裇,以及向參與展覽遊戲的市民送出900份禮物,當中包括學會紀念水瓶、原子筆套裝和雨傘。

HKIS 35th Anniversary Celebration Memoirs of the HKIS Past Presidents – Celebrating 35 Years of Excellence 香港測量師學會35周年誌慶 – 歷屆會長回憶錄

The year 2019 marks the 35th anniversary of the service and commitment by The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors towards the surveying profession and the community. To celebrate this joyous occasion, a new column in the HKIS monthly newsletter - *Surveyors Times*, will be dedicated to the Past Presidents for sharing their precious memories, invaluable insights and significant achievements during their tenure. The articles will be published in the *Surveyors Times*, starting from December 2018 to November 2019.

In the first issue, Past President (1995/96) Sr CY Leung shares with us the history of the Institute and how HKIS became a founding member of the Coalition of Professional Services.



Sr CY Leung Past President (1995/96)

The HKIS was founded in 1984. In the year before, preparations were well underway. Those years had a special place in Hong Kong's history.

Negotiations between China and the United Kingdom over Hong Kong's future dragged on. Agreement proved elusive. While some chose to turn their back on this city to which they owed their upbringing and wealth, a group of surveyors did the opposite. They got together to found the HKIS - the local institute to represent the growing number of local surveyors and to tackle the growing range of local issues.

Sr Kan Fook-yee who later became the first President of the Institute led the efforts. Sr Bob Pope, Sr Wan Man-yee and I were responsible to form the General Practice Division. The three of us had regular meetings over drinks in the Lau Ling Bar in the Furama Hotel. The rest, as they say, is history.

For a few years, the HKIS had a parallel run with the Hong Kong branch of the RICS. The leaderships of the two bodies double-across. Then the Hong Kong branch of the RICS formed a Dissolution Committee to start the dissolution process. An Extraordinary General Meeting was held by the Branch where the motion to dissolve was carried, thus giving the HKIS the status of being the only professional body representing surveyors in Hong Kong.

So 1983/84 and the ensuing few years was a period of far reaching changes for Hong Kong as a whole and for its surveyors. The lessons are crystal clear - we stayed, we faced the challenges head on and we achieved.

When the HKIS was 14 years old, the best known date on our calendar - 1 July 1997 - came and went. Other than the unexpected rain and the solemn ceremonies, life went on. In hindsight it was sort of anti-climax.

By then, land and the related housing reforms on the Mainland of China were well underway. On 22 March 1988, Shanghai released the tender documents to launch the first sale of land use rights since the founding of the People's Republic. Three Presidents of the HKIS were honorary advisers to the Shanghai Government. They were Sr Kan Fook-yee, Sr Francis Lau Shiu-kwan and yours truly.

By the time when the Five-star flag and the Bauhinia flag were raised inside the Grand Hall of the Convention and Exhibition Centre, the property market on the Mainland was 9 years old. It had become a very sizeable market for Hong Kong surveyors and other professionals. Here I believe lies another lesson - see future opportunities beyond current challenges and grab both by their horns.

Hard work of course. One of the things that we did and did right was getting all the 10 major professional bodies together. In 2001, the HKIS together with nine others founded the Coalition of Professional Services with the ten bodies as the ten members. Sr Lau Ping-cheung, another HKIS Past President, and I were two of the three initiators.

The Coalition managed to get the country's recognition of the importance of professional services. Hence the provisions in the 2003 CEPA and its annual supplemental agreements that gives Hong Kong professionals preferential treatments.

The Mainland is a vast market and a varied source of employment, so are the Greater Bay Area and the Belt and Road economies. Spreading our wings over any border has challenges. British surveyors first came to Hong Kong more than 170 years ago. It was not easy for them either.

The 35th anniversary is a good time to collect our past experiences, to aspire for a bold and exciting future and to inspire the young and the energetic.






HKIS BIM Conference 2018

A captivating, opening keynote address was delivered by Ms Ada YS Fung, BBS, the Chairperson of the Construction Industry Council's Committee on Building Information Modelling, before the HKIS divisional representatives addressed existing and potential applications of BIM relating to their specialist areas in a series of insightful talks. Earlier, the programme began with an opening speech by the HKIS Vice-President (2018) Sr Winnie Shiu.

Sr Cheu Yuk Yi, Yvonne, Vice Chairman of the Land Surveying Division (2018), explored the possibilities of Enriching BIM with Geospatial Information, while Sr Yew Yat Ming, Edmond, Chairman of the Planning and Development Division (2018), asked: How Technology Shapes our City? – from Planning and Development Perspectives.



HKIS BIM Conference

On 30 November, I was invited by the Chairman of the HKIS BIM Committee, Sr YY Yip, as one of the guest speakers for the HKIS BIM Conference 2018. The conference's theme was "The Dream Role of Surveyors in BIM for Land Development, Construction and Property Life Cycle". On behalf of the BSD, my shared topic was "BIM: Beyond Design and Project Management". With the Government's promotion and adoption of BIM technology in capital works projects valued at over HK\$30 million, as well as the electronic building plan submission, which will be implemented by the Buildings Department soon, building surveyors should be wellequipped and familiar with the use of BIM and other new technologies in their design, project management, and building maintenance work.

My presentation generally compared the traditional and future workflow of surveyors with BIM support, the concepts of big data management, digitisation, cloud hubs, smart cities and artificial intelligence, etc, and showed how such new technologies can help enhance the efficiency and accuracy of surveyors' dayto-day professional work. Other divisional representatives also shared their expertise on BIM. We hope all participants found this conference enlightening.









HKIS Luncheon with the Home Affairs Department

Some HKIS representatives and I joined a luncheon with representatives of the Home Affairs Department on 5 December. Since the public consultation on the licencing regime of property services was in progress, we shared a lot of views on it during this meeting. Concerning the bid-rigging problems in the building maintenance industry, I reiterated that the BSD's proposal to set up a Building Repair and Maintenance Authority (BRMA) should be the most effective solution for regulating such a malpractice, while the URA's Building Rehabilitation Platform should be regarded as a pioneering scheme of the BRMA. I also briefed everyone on the BSD's new proposal to set up a Building Affairs Expert Determination system to tackle disputes over water seepage, unauthorised building works, etc.

HKIS Luncheon with the Secretary for Development

On 6 December, we joined another HKIS luncheon with the Secretary for Development. We had a fruitful discussion on various topics such as Lantau development and other issues related to the building industry and surveying profession. I particularly stressed the maintenance problems of those curtain wall designs that are common in high-rise residential buildings due to GFA concessions. Incidents of glass panels breaking during typhoons and the water seepage problems of curtain walls are "time bombs" which have great impact to our works in building inspection and maintenance. The BSD will vigorously follow up on this issue with the relevant government departments and its counterparts in other industries.

Symposium on Innovation

On 6 December, I attended the Symposium on Innovation organised by the Architectural Services Department. The Symposium was held at Tai Kwun's JC Cube. The guest speakers from various organisations shared a lot of valuable insights into and knowledge of building innovations. HKIS President Sr Dick Kwok was an invited speaker who discussed building innovation from a surveyor's perspective and new technologies that have already been adopted by surveyors in their professional work.

物業管理業監管局現正就物業管理公司及物業管理人 發牌制度進行公眾諮詢,並於民政事務總署 12 月 5 日的午餐會成為熱話。同場,我們把握機會宣傳 BSD 一直提倡成立的《樓宇維修工程監管局》(BRMA) 為切實對抗圍標的方案。市建局正在推行樓宇復修 策略研究,可見將來的樓宇復修資訊平台亦可作為 BRMA 的先導。

於 12 月 6 日與發展局局長與學會的午餐會上,我們就大嶼山發展及其他土地議題進行了非常豐富的討論。為了得到可建樓面面積上最大的得益,住宅高樓大廈近年廣泛使用玻璃幕牆。有見近月颱風帶來的破壞,BSD 藉此提出我們對此都市計時炸彈的憂慮。我們亦以此為 BSD 來年重點跟進項目之一。

建築署於 12 月 6 日在大館舉辦了一場以「創新」為 題的研討會。各個專業學會及組織代表均發表了各自 於建築上的應用到的創新技術,當中包括學會會長就 測量師應用創新科技的分享。

Assessments of Professional Competency: Part II Examination

The Education Committee arranged 19 assessment panels from 8-15 December for the APC Part II Examination. Out of 54 candidates, 42 passed the assessment. This marked a pass rate of 78% (cf 69% in 2017). The assessment panels nominated a few candidates for Outstanding Presentation Awards. A big thanks go to the assessment panel chairpersons and members, and congratulations go out to the successful candidates. Welcome aboard!

We greatly welcome Sr Alex Fong, who will be the new YSG representative to GPD Council in the coming year. Sr Kitty Ng will continue her term with the GPD Council and support various GPD committees and activities. We thank Sr Kendy Cheuk for working closely with the GPD Council and her other contributions over the last two years.

CPD: Visit to The Mills, a landmark Industrial Revitalisation Project Undertaken by the Nan Fung Group (Code: 2018206)

I am pleased to report that the visit to The Mills on 1 December was a huge success. The quota of 60 visitors was quickly filled and only one registered attendee did not turn up.

Mr Geoffrey Lo, General Manager, Property Development Department, HK Property Division of Nan Fung Development Limited, gave an overview of the project's town planning and

subsequent land applications. The Mills is actually comprised of two lots. One is whollyowned, while the other is under multiple ownership. Nan Fung Group was able to take advantage of the Government's industrial revitalisation policy to convert the single-owned industrial building (Mills 4 & 5) to commercial use at a nil premium. However, the multiple ownership adjacent lot (where Mill 6 was located) required Nan Fung to apply for and receive a No Objection Letter (NOL) based on a Town Planning Board-approved scheme. Mr Lo stressed the challenges of negotiating with the Lands Department over the NOL and Special Waiver, which had to be signed simultaneously to enable the "one complex" concept to be achieved. A premium appeal was submitted and quickly resolved with a reasonable reduction.

Participants were treated to a guided tour by the operation team led by Amy and Ryan of Nan Fung. The guides showed their guests the high-tech textile lab, co-work spaces, and innovative textile recycle and state-of-the-art apparel design concepts – all of which were very new to most humble surveyors. The building's conversion maximised an advantage presented by its age: high ceilings that allowed natural light to reach its core areas.

The Mills is one of Nan Fung's landmark revitalisation projects. It comprises three main pillars: Fabrica; Shopfloor; and the Centre for Heritage, Arts and Textile (CHAT), which build on a foundation of legacy and heritage. Visitors can explore the continuation of an authentic Hong Kong story in which the story of its textile industry are interwoven with the experiences of innovation, culture, and learning.

This unique destination opened to the public on 6 December. There are plenty of functions and opportunities that the venue offers. I suggest that members visit the cleverly-converted factory buildings and appreciate the work put into them by many building professionals and surveyors. CPD: Application of Computer-assisted Mass Appraisals (CAMA) in the Rating and Valuation Department, Hong Kong (Code: 2018196)

Thanks go to Sr Ivy Chan, Senior Valuation Surveyor of the Rating and Valuation Department (RVD) for delivering this CPD on 4 December. Sr Chan first introduced the RVD's core functions and Hong Kong's rating system. She then shared the RVD's experiences in applying CAMA techniques, which were first introduced during the mid-1980s to assist property valuations. Since then, CAMA has been extensively applied to the RVD's work, thereby enabling valuation staff to systematically assess numerous properties within a short time frame and improve the consistency and quality of valuation work. For instance, about 80% of the valuations (some two million assessments) covering office, industrial, residential, and retail properties are carried out within a short period during the annual revaluation exercise.

By applying the following CAMA techniques, namely a: (i) reference assessment approach (RAA), (ii) multiple regression analysis (MRA); and (iii) geographic information system-assisted valuation approach, one can complete the annual revaluation exercise for rating purposes and scrutinise the adequacy of the stated consideration in property sales transactions for stamp duty purposes within a tight schedule. Sr Chan then elaborated on the methodology and standardised practices of applying RAA and MRA. Emphasis was also placed on the application of statistical measures to ensure valuation accuracy.

Last, but not least, Sr Chan highlighted that while CAMA provides a useful tool for analysing rental patterns and formulating consistent value estimates, the responsibility for determining assessment levels and ensuring valuation accuracy remains with valuers, who must exercise their professional skills and judgement throughout the entire CAMA process, particularly when deciding on the best valuation model and scrutinising the end results to confirm the assessments.

物業管理服務條例

物業管理業監管局(下稱監管局)於2018年11月21日發表有關「物業管理公司及物業管理人的發牌制度建議的諮詢文件」(https://www.pmsahk.org.hk/tc/licensing/consultation.html),並諮詢業界及市民對發牌制度的建議,就着這份諮詢文件,物業設施管理組將進行深入的研究,希望能站在會員利益方面,發表意見,按這份諮詢文件,初步有以下關注:

- 1. 按諮詢文件第 4 章第 4 段,物業管理需要多方面的專業知識,而物業管理服務條例 (第 626 章)(下稱物管條例)附表一,列出七項物業管理服務類別:
 - (1) 關乎物業的一般管理服務;
 - (2) 物業所處環境的管理;
 - (3) 物業的維修、保養及改善;
 - (4) 關乎物業的財務及資產管理;
 - (5) 關乎物業的設施管理:
 - (6) 關乎物業管理所涉及的人員的人力資源管理;及
 - (7) 關乎物業管理的法律服務。

根據物管條例第三條,監管局可根據物管條例,若物業管理公司的業務涉及提供多於一項服務類別的物業管理服務,便要申請物業管理公司牌照,例如本會有很多會員的公司從事物業工程顧問的業務,也經經常可便是提供以上第(3)項服務類別和(7)項服務類別和(7)項服務類別,便需要申請牌照,但實際上這些公司也要申請物業管理服務,若這些公司也要申請物業管理服務,若這些公司也要申請物業管理。公司牌照,會否令到很多類似的公司需要申請常理。不会人物管條例設立的目的是規管及管制物業管理服務,所以可會以第(1)項服務類別為主項、若有公司的業務也涉及第(2)項至第(7)項服務類別其中可項或多項,才需要申請牌照呢?

2. 物管條例為物業管理人定立兩個級別的發牌制度,當物業從業員須擔任管理或監督角色的時候,便需要註冊成為物業管理人,在以上第 1 點所提及的,物業管理公司的業務涉及提供多於一項服務類別時,便申請物業管理公司牌照,但物業管理人則只提供其中一項服務類別,而且擔當管理或監督角色的時候,的需要註冊成為物業管理人,如此說來,所有前線的同事,若他們有管理或監督的角色,不論他們是維修,是至物業管理公司內的其他專業人士,如人事資源經理、會計、律師等,當他們有管理或監督的角色時,便需要註冊,這樣會否令很多不是真正從事物業管理的人士,也需要註冊呢?

- 3. 諮詢文件第5章第2.2段表二,若住宅物業每3,000個單位或以下,便需要最少一名第1級持牌物業管理人,若住宅物業每1,500個單位或以下,便需要最少一名第2級持牌物業管理人,而非住宅部份每100,000平方米或以下,便需要最少一名第1級持牌物業管理人,而非住宅部份每30,000平方米或以下,便需要最少一名第2級持牌物業管理人,但這裏沒有提及非住宅的類別,因為管理商場、停車場、公共空間等所需的人手比例完全不同,不能一概而論。
- 4. 諮詢文件第5章第4段提及費用水平如下:
 - a. 物業管理公司牌費年費:\$6.000
 - b. 物業管理人 (第 1 級) 牌照年費:\$1,200
 - c. 物業管理人 (第2級) 牌照年費:\$400

很多會員因工作緣故已領有多個不同的學會或專業資格,每年要支付的相關費用已不菲,這個費用水平是 否合理和可以負擔呢?

- 5. 諮詢文件第6章第1段提及持牌物業管理人(第1級) 發牌準則如下:
 - a. 最低學歷
 - (i) 監管局指明的物業管理學位或同等學歷;或
 - (ii) 其他學位或同等學歷
 - b. 最低累積的本地物業管理工作經驗
 - (i) 提交申請前的六年內具備至少三年
 - (ii) 若持有其他學位或同等學歷,提交申請前的 八年內具備至少五年
 - c. 專業資格
 - (i) 監管局指明的物業管理相關專業團體的會員;
 - (ii) 其他經監管局審核及認可的同等專業團體的 會員,並接受監管局就物業管理專業水平的 評核。

諮詢文件並沒有清楚指明那些是認可的專業團體,本組當然要求監管局確認香港測量師學會必定是認可的學會,但為了確保物業管理的專業水平,監管局需要清楚列明那些是認可的專業團體和釐定準則,以免影響行業的專業水平。

以上是初步的意見,若會員有其他意見可以隨時與物業設施管理組反映,但更重要的是請於 2019 年 1 月 18 日或之前,透過電郵 (consultation@pmsahk.org.hk)、郵寄或傳真 (3696 1100) 的方式提交回應意見表,以便監管局草擬相關的附屬法例,並提交立法會進行審議。

PFMD AGM

A PFMD AGM was held on 6 November. Some of its highlights are reported below.

a. Research Project

The PFMD has commissioned the Hong Kong Polytechnic University to conduct a study on the "Application of RFID Technology in Facilitating E-waste Collection and Recycling". The study will be finalised by the end of 2018. A CPD to report the findings will be held in February 2019.

b. CPD Event and Site Visits

Altogether ten CPD events and technical site visits have been conducted in 2018. The CPD Committee will continue to organise more events for members in 2019.

c. Membership Growth

A Task Force has been set up to review the Rules and Guidelines of the PFMD's APC, which is now in force after the PFMD Council approved it.

d. Quality Property and Facility Management Award (QPFMA) 2018

Jointly organised by the HKIS and Hong Kong Association of Property Management Companies, the competition attracted 118 participants this year. The award winners will be officially announced during the QPFMA Award Presentation Ceremony cum Dinner on 8 January 2019.

An informal meeting with the AIQS and NZIQS was held on 19 November at the International Convention Centre in Sydney. The 12th China Cup International Regatta (CCIR) 2018 took place over five days from 8-12 November on the waters of Hong Kong and Shenzhen. In total, 112 boats and around 1,500 sailors representing almost 40 different regions and nations competed across a range of keelboat divisions. There were a total of eight races during these five days: a Hong Kong-to-Shenzhen passage race, a whole-day round island race, and six inshore races.

After gaining experience from competing at the CCIR in 2016 and 2017, the HKIS Sailing Team recruited new sailors such as Karen, Tony, Cooper, and others to join the CCIR 2018. The Team performed well in the first race on 8 November, which was a 12 nautical-mile passage race from Hong Kong to Daya Bay off Shenzhen. Amongst the 20 boats of the HKPN Divisions, the HKIS Team, using the smallest sailing boat of the regatta, was one of five boats that finished the race under the difficult condition of almost zero breeze. On 9 November, the boat speed of the inshore race was seriously affected by light wind conditions. On 10 November, the Team had four tough races under blustery wind conditions. On 11 November, it was a 15 nautical-mile round island race under stormy winds of 5-6 on the Beaufort scale.

The last race was very challenging, as the Team's small sailing boat faced harsh conditions. With all members contributing in one way or another toward the same goal and a good team spirit, the Team achieved 6th place in the HKPN Division B, which was a rewarding

result. The most noticeable experience for the Team was how members improved their performances.

The Captain welcomes all HKIS members who are interested in sailing to join the Team.
